

Hazy Dream Instructions

Congratulations on your purchase of Hazy Dream! This set is very easy to use and meant to be versatile on all images.

Please note, with the purchase of this set, you are responsible for knowing how to upload, save, and run actions. Please save these to your actions folder so you can find them later if they are lost. Included in the set are 3 types of actions:

1. **Light Enhancers:** The light enhancers are meant to be used first. Use these actions to pop your photo with light or brighten photos that need to be lighter. Make sure to play with each of them as they will each change your photo in different ways. With light infusion, make sure to mask off your subject as this is meant to brighten your background or any areas you want some more light.
2. **Hazes:** Within the hazes you will find simple hazes as well as hazes that have left and right sides. For the ones that have the left and right sides, you can play with each layer to keep the haze at the same side as your sun. Or you can use both layers to engulf your images with warm light. With the hazy edge action, make sure to play with the opacity as well as mask off any areas of your subjects you wish. All hazes are meant to be added as you like, tweaked, turned down and masked off areas you do not want your haze to be overpowering. Perfect snow is perfect to use on outside images with snow. Make sure to mask off your subject as desired.
3. **Finishing Steps:** After you have completed your editing process, use these steps to finish your image. With hazes some color can become too soft for you liking. For that use the paint back color and deepen color to how you like it. After you are compete, run cut the haze and sharpen to bring your subjects back. Make sure to run these on a flattened layer or on your background layer, as sharpening layers are not able to run on top.
